 - a. Past fact standing in our position of "I am in Christ."
 - b. We now have the righteousness of Jesus Christ to come before God with our prayers and petitions.

 - 2) SANCTIFICATION (Present)— When we are justified, the work of sanctification begins in our born-again life. We continue our walk with Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit.
 - a. Walking in the fullness of salvation as the Spirit of God –the Holy Spirit transforms our perspective, our will, and our choices for His purposes and plan.
 - b. It is in the present, a progressive process of being "conformed in the image of Christ."

 - 3) GLORIFICATION (Future)— God's final removal of sin in the life of the saints in the eternal state. At Christ's coming, the glory of God—His honor, praise, majesty, and holiness-will be realized in us. Instead of being mortals burdened with sin nature we are changed into holy immortals with direct unhindered access to God's presence, and we will enjoy holy communion with Him throughout eternity.
 - a) Our future promise. Permanently "with Christ for eternity."


2. Who is the Holy Spirit?

What marks a true follower of Jesus Christ, no matter what religious denomination, certain type of worship, or adherence to some form of doctrine it is in hearing His voice the we become followers.



These three things go together as followers of Jesus Christ in John 10:27

- 1. My sheep, the ones who hear My voice.
- 2. I know them. He knows us completely.
- 3. And they follow me. We hear His voice and follow Him.







- Sheep follow the Shepherd not because he drives them but simply because they hear his voice.
- If we don't hear His voice, we can't follow Jesus.
- Hearing His voice is what makes us His Sheep. He knows us, and we follow Him.





Three distinct features of Hearing God's voice which are life-changing once they are understood:

1. Personal – every voice is unique, as we personally relate to Him, we come to know His voice. This is our protection in relating to Him personally, and more intimately over time.





Three distinct features of Hearing God's voice which are life-changing once they are understood:

2. Intangible –unable to be touched or grasped; not having physical presence.

God's voice is not restricted to any place or time you have nothing to cling on to but His voice.



Three distinct features of Hearing God's voice which are life-changing once they are understood:

3. Present – in relation to time God's voice is always in the present, the Eternal now.

Being in the present moment in the presence of God –"I AM" hearing His voice.



Hearing God's voice produces faith. The secret of faith comes by hearing God's voice.

"So, faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ."


Romans 10:17





Logos – in the Bible is the mind, counsel and purpose of God – all comprehensive. The counsel of God that never changes. It is eternal out of time.







"In the beginning [before all time] was the Word (Christ), and the Word was with God, and the Word was God Himself. He was [continually existing] in the beginning [co-eternally] with God."

John 1:1-2 (AMP)





Jesus is the personified Logos.

Jesus said, "He that has seen me, has seen the Father."



Rhema – is only a word that is spoken.

"But he answered, 'It is written,

Man shall not live on bread alone,

But on every word (Rhema) that comes from

the mouth of God."

Matthew 4:4





- So, man lives by every word that is spoken out of the mouth of God.
- The total counsel of God (Logos) is more that our finite minds can comprehend.



• God measures out the Logos to us in the Rhema – the word spoken to us personally.



• The total counsel of God is imparted to us in portions as we are able to receive it.

Rhema by Rhema.



Jesus said God has a Rhema for us each day.


The difference between Logos and Rehma LOGOS – Eternal in the Heaven unchanged. RHEMA – Coming down to us, personal, a word that we hear, something that is spoken. Therefore, in Romans 10:17 is must be Rhema So, faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the (Rhema) word of Christ.







The Bible does not say that faith comes from reading the Bible.

Many times, we read the Bible and hear nothing. All you have is black marks on white paper in front of your eyes. You can try processing it, but you receive no faith.









Process by which Faith comes from hearing the (Rhema) spoken word of God. Three stages:

3. Out of hearing faith comes. Hearing is not usually instantaneous. We must come to a frame of mind that comes from the renewal of the mind, a change of perspective through the Holy Spirit.

- 3. Jesus always meets us right where we are at if we simply give Him the gift that God gave us our time.




- 4. With time, we become more intimate in our prayers by asking specific questions of Him and waiting in Holy expectancy for His answer, no matter how long it might take.
- 5. We learn to discern His voice—filtering our thoughts through His written word and His Word written on our hearts by the Holy Spirit.



- 6. We begin to understand God can talk to us anyway He chooses...through Scriptures, through wise counsel, through our circumstances, even through an unexpected source; and especially, in that still small voice.
- 7. We are now building a relationship of trust in God as we continue to grow in faith in Him.




