What is the Gospel of Peace?

Gospel (meaning good news, good story) is the story of Christ's life and teachings, esp. as contained in the first four books of the New Testament, namely Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

In Spiritual warfare, the Good News Gospel is like strong, sturdy footgear that keeps us steady and moving forward on our Christian journey and our "Call" in life.





Gospel of peace is the Good News of Jesus Christ, meaning:

- First and foremost, complete SALVATION from sin and death.
- Continual forgiveness and freedom from all bondages.
- Healing everywhere we hurt.
- Righteousness and abundant living.





Gospel of peace is the Good News of Jesus Christ, meaning:

- Peace that surpasses all understanding.
- Joy that knows no bounds.
- The perfect Love that fills our void to overflowing.

It is that Kingdom of God found within and around us in Christ Jesus – choosing the "effective will of God" in ourselves and to all in our sphere of influence.





As Spiritual warriors, in a Kingdom where surrender to Jesus Christ is the key, our part is to walk in that Peace each day throughout every opportunity that comes into our path.





## **Obstacles versus Opportunities**

Opportunity is defined as a favorable occasion when we have the option of making a decision that could have a positive impact.

While we all experience obstacles in our day-today lives, it is the Holy Spirit led Believer that sees obstacles as opportunities.

- 1. How do we discern or perceive the situation when an obstacle is encountered?
  - a) In Numbers 13 14, when a member of each of the 12 tribes of the Israelites were called to check out the land God had promised them, all but Caleb and Joshua, saw the situation as impossible. The negative opinion of the 10 caused a rebellion among the people. They failed to realize that God does not operate from our limited human perspective. They suffered a failure of faith, as a result of fear and lack of trust in the Lord.





- 1. How do we discern or perceive the situation when an obstacle is encountered?
  - b) As Believers in Jesus Christ, we have the renewal of the mind, our perspective is not based on our limited natural abilities, but rather on God's supernatural power. Our part is wholehearted commitment to obey.





# The challenge is the approach to obstacles

- 2. How do we know what to say or do when faced with an obstacle we are called to overcome?
  - a) Sensitivity to the still small voice of the Holy Spirit reveals insight that we would never achieve otherwise. A divine connection for a divine opportunity.
  - b) Sensitivity to the voice of Holy Spirit requires abiding in Christ each day in prayer.

My sheep hear my voice, I know them, and they follow me... John 10:27





- 2. How do we know what to say or do when faced with an obstacle we are called to overcome?
  - c) We are given not only faith, but everything we need, as we are used as instruments of peace. Our intellect, our pride, our knowledge has nothing to do with this victory. Example: Apostle Paul in Greece experience





## The challenge is the approach to obstacles

2. How do we know what to say or do when faced with an obstacle we are called to overcome?

And I, brethren, when I came to you, did not come with excellence of speech or of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God. For I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified. I was with you in weakness, in fear, and in much trembling. And my speech and my preaching were not with persuasive words of human wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, that your faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God.

1Corinthians 2:1-5





- 2. How do we know what to say or do when faced with an obstacle we are called to overcome?
  - d) Since this is a divine appointment, it is through God that we are given direction what to say, what not say, or when to say something in due season.





## The challenge is the approach to obstacles

- 3. If we are not surrendered, we cannot be used for God's purposes.
  - a) We are in a battle that is going on in the spiritual realms whether we want to believe it or not. To overcome requires continual surrender to the leading, guiding, prompting of the Holy Spirit.

For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.

- 3. If we are not surrendered, we cannot be used for God's purposes.
  - b) Jesus is the Lord of our lives. While it is up to us not to ignore God-given opportunities, our perfect surrender is required to step out in faith.





- 4. Jesus is our way-maker, the fountain of living waters.
  - a) We possess spiritual gifts which we can use to ignite the Gospel of Peace in the lives of others.
  - b) The Lord gives us everything we need to do what He calls us to do.





## The challenge is the approach to obstacles

4. Jesus is our way-maker, the fountain of living waters.

Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as He determines.

1 Corinthians 12: 7-11





- 5. The battle belongs to God, our part is to stay in line with His will and His way.
  - a) It is in keeping our priority to God first that He fills us with the unconditional love He has for others. In other words, God loves others (whoever they might be) just as much as He loves us. Our motives are made pure.
  - b) To be used as instruments of this perfect love in seamless servanthood to others reflects His love for them.
  - c) This reaches beyond all barriers!





Since we live by faith, and not by fear, opportunities on the onset may be disguised in obstacles of inconvenience, difficulties, or even danger.

This is where the **power of prayer** takes us beyond our natural inclinations of self preservation into the realm of supernatural instruments of peace. From self-serving to God-serving for the greater glory of His Kingdom without end.

The Process: We all think we are going through this process to get to the end, constantly looking to the end, when to God the process itself is the end. In other words, "It is the little things that count," in our personal lives.



Russell Conwell (1843 - 1925)

Russell Herman Conwell was an American Baptist minister, orator, philanthropist, lawyer, and writer.
