1. Eros love refers to physical attraction, passion, intense desire for something and is generally referred to as sexual love or desire – from which our English word "erotic" is derived.

2. Storge love is used as a noun and refers to family affection. A familial love referring to natural or instinctual affection, such as the love of a parent towards offspring and vice versa.

3. Philia love is the word for genuine affection or heart-felt love. This type of love can be associated with not only friendship, but loyalties to family or community.

4. Agape love is pure, perfect, unconditional, sacrificial love. The noblest form of the meaning of love, not simply an emotion stirred within our hearts, but a standard by which we live that is wholly selfless and spiritual in nature. This is God's love, and it is the immeasurable, incomparable love for mankind.
