- 1. OPEN DOORS for deception creating footholds which can lead to strongholds:
 - derogatory thoughts that enter in our mind, and we receive them
 - unhealed wounds from the past
 - from the words or actions of others in our life

The Breastplate of Righteousness

- 2. RED FLAGS in our character (character defects) can provide insight into areas of our lives in need of healing. A few include excessive fear, anxiety, controlling, critical, mocking, addictive behavior, obsession, depression, oversensitive, relationship issues, etc.
- 3. ROOT CAUSES of wounds in need of healing coming from hurts perpetrated by individuals or circumstances we have encountered in our past.

The Breastplate of Righteousness So, how do we get TRUE freedom? As children of God, we have the right to a healthy emotional life, knowing that we belong, have worth, and are competent individuals. Yet, this concept is fleeting in a temporal world because it is built on man's competence. Our righteousness will never measure up.

However, in Christ, we are **justified** through the *Righteousness of Jesus Christ that resides within us* through FAITH, *not works*.

R E C A P The Breastplate of Righteousness

The Law set the standard of righteousness, but Jesus is the only one who fulfilled the Law because He was Righteousness Himself. Therefore, by faith in the Messiah and not through the letter of the Law, we have Righteousness abiding within us. Therefore, we are worthy!

But now apart from the law the righteousness of God has been made known, to which the law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to ALL WHO BELIEVE.

What is the Truth?

Jesus is the center of our belief, the chief cornerstone upon which our faith is built, the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. **HE IS TRUTH!**

What is Truth?

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THE SILENCE OF THE TRUTH

HAT IS TRUTH?" I asked.

"Ah," said the teacher, "a question asked by philosophers throughout the ages. Do you know what the word *philosophy* means? It comes from two Greek words: *sophia*, which means knowledge, and *philo*, which means love. So *philosophy* can be taken to mean the love of knowledge or wisdom. Man has been pondering and seeking after the truth for thousands of years. And after all those years, do you know what the conclusion of philosophy is?"

"No."

"No conclusion," he said. "They all came up with different answers ... no answer. And yet in the midst of all this, the question was once posed, in a very unique context, not by a philosopher, but by a man of bloodshed. He asked the question to one of his prisoners. The man was Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor of Judea ... and the prisoner was the Messiah. So Pilate posed the question, 'What is truth?' Then he went outside to the multitude and said, 'I find no basis for a charge against Him.' So what was the answer to his question?"

"He didn't give an answer," I said. "There was no answer."

"But there was an answer," said the teacher, "in the absence of the answer... in the silence of the truth. It was in His not saying anything, that He said everything, in His not answering, that the question was answered. Truth is deeper than words. The truth wasn't the truth about something, or even the truth about Him-it was Him, standing there right in front of Pilate's eyes, in flesh-and-blood reality. You see, the *idea* of truth, the *talk* of truth, and the *study* of truth . . . is *not* the truth. Philosophies and religions may be about the truth, but that which is about the truth can blind you from seeing the truth itself. Never let yourself end up in the realm of the about and lose that which the about is all about. The truth is that which is . . . as God is. The truth is Him. And so the only way to know the truth . . . is to know Him . . . directly, personally, in His presence, face-to-face, heart to heart ... What is truth?" asked the teacher, "He is the truth. And what is the answer to all philosophy, the love of knowledge? It is to love the truth. Therefore . . . the answer . . . is to love Him."

The Mission: Today, leave the "realm of the about" and go beyond the talk and words to the bare truth of His presence. Be still and know that He is God.

The Parable of Nassir

Take heart, for it is in the heart that you will find the answer. The following is a simple parable.

As the story goes, there once was a man named Nassir who, for whatever reason or reasons, found himself trapped in a deep, dark, slimy pit with absolutely no visible means of escape. Nassir began to cry out for help— begging and pleading to anyone who might come along and hear his sobbing.

Alas, along came a friend, someone he knew for sure would help him out, after all, it was his best friend. The closer the friend neared the edge of the pit, the more he realized the dire predicament that Nassir was in, and he became too afraid to help his friend for fear of falling in himself.

And so, the friend, out of his own perceived need of self-preservation, decided to turn away and not be a part of Nassir or his "situation."

Again, Nassir began to cry out, this time with more intensity. As time passed, along came a counselor- a learned advisor to many people in the nearby village. He heard Nassir's pleas and asked him just how he got into the pit in the first place. The noted counselor began to analyze the many possible reasons why Nassir ended up in this pit.

After pondering Nassir's situation, the counselor gave him a list of possible solutions for dealing with his circumstance. He even tossed in some medicinal herbs to help Nassir cope with his dire predicament.

But these strategies only served to frustrate Nassir even further. Although very learned in his profession, the counselor could only go so far as to assist Nassir in finding his way out.

Never quite comprehending the entire picture, the counselor could provide Nassir with limited answers to only part of his dilemma, the result: Nassir was still in the pit.

The Parable of Nassir

As time passed, Nassir began to feel that his situation was hopeless, yet he continued to cry out for help. To his relief, he heard the voice of the local clergyman whom he had heard so many previous times in church. Nassir was sure that this man of God who gave such aweinspiring sermons and tearful testimonials would indeed help him to get out of the pit.



The Parable of Nassir

As the clergyman came to the edge of the pit and solemnly listened to his plight, Nassir thought, "Yes, this clergyman has a direct line to God, and God will surely help me out of this pit." Much to Nassir's amazement, the clergyman began to speculate and to judge why God would put poor Nassir into this pit in the first place and thus preached his well-versed sermon on "Just How God works."

He filled Nassir with many antidotes for pleasing God. With jubilant anticipation, Nassir was sure that if he could just follow all of the instructions and keep all of the commands, God would be happy with him and *get him out*.

But to no avail, for poor Nassir was still in the pit. Filled with anger and disappointment, he admonished the clergyman for trying to *be* God rather than helping him to *find* God.

The Parable of Nassir

Despair, desperation, and hopelessness were now permeating Nassir's every thought until he felt as if the very life was being drained out of him.

Eventually, with what he felt was his last breath, he cried out, "Lord God, my heavenly Father, I surrender everything! Help me get out of this pit!"

The Parable of Nassir

Deep within the very core of his being, he heard a still, quiet voice clearly say, "Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with My righteous right hand" (Isaiah 41:10).



The Parable of Nassir

Nassir could now feel new life being poured into his being— a peace that surpassed all understanding and a joy that filled him with unspeakable strength.

He knew his Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, was there in his midst- that He had been there all along, patiently waiting for Nassir to call upon him, because He loved Nassir.

The Parable of Nassir

Christ was not at the edge of the pit calling out instructions. He was in the very midst of the pit *with him*. God had sent Nassir the right hand of righteousness, His only Son Jesus Christ, to personally help him out of the pit.



The Parable of Nassir

And Christ took his hand, his heart and his soul and delivered him from this miry pit of despair and hopelessness. Nassir now knew that he was on the path of salvation and that only Christ would take him every step of the way.



Jesus is the only Way, the only Truth, and the only Life...the only way to God.

KEEP YOUR FOCUS ON JESUS!






- 2. There is a significant difference between trying to believe and knowing without a shadow of doubt.
 - a. Trying to believe often involves studying, reading, researching, attending studies, or following the latest popular preachers with their schools of thought (works from the outside in).
 - b. However, unfortunately, you often end up with the paralysis of analysis, losing hope because you leaned on man for the answers instead of going to the Answer!





- 2. There is a significant difference between trying to believe and knowing without a shadow of doubt.
 - c. We are not to worship the tools, but rather the source of the tools...God; Father, Son & Holy Spirit.
 - d. Knowing without a shadow of doubt involves personal EXPERIENCE WITH CHRIST!





3. Believing without a shadow of doubt brings mountain-moving faith in your prayers.

So, Jesus answered and said to them, "Have faith in God. For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, 'Be removed and be cast into the sea,' and DOES NOT DOUBT in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says.
